16TH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF THE WORLD FEDERATION OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPISTS (WFOT) in Collaboration with the 48th Japanese Occupational Therapy Congress and Expo



Three (3) research papers and poster presentations were exhibited by an Occupational Therapy students and faculty members during the 16TH International Congress of The World Federation of Occupational Therapists (WFOT) last June 18 – 21, 2014. The event was held in Yokohama, Japan and attended by 6,400 delegates from over 72 countries.



In collaboration with the 48th Japanese Occupational Therapy Congress & Expo, the congress was hosted by the World Federation of Occupational Therapists (WFOT), the Japanese Association of Occupational Therapists (JAOT), and the Science Council of Japan.



The congress focused on themes such as disaster preparedness, response, and recovery, inter-professional collaboration and the role of occupational therapy, and meeting the demands of education and research in occupational therapy. Other concerns discussed were the progress into evidence-based practice and quality of occupational therapy, the integration of the past and present for the future of occupational therapy, and community-based occupational therapy.



The CDU delegates were also able to make connections with the representatives from other countries and discuss the possibility of collaborating on planned research studies.



Among these delegates were Prof. Patricia De Witt of the University of Witwatersbrand, Johannesburg, Dr. Samantha Ashby of the University of Newcastle, Australia, Hanai Akiko, of the Graduate School of Medicine of Kyoto University, Iwakami Sayaka of the International University of Health and Welfare, and Marilyn Pattison, Executive Director of the WFOT.

The next WFOT Congress will be in the year 2018 in Cape Town, South Africa.
