


Congratulations to all the women and men who are working hard to come out once again with a new edition of the official CDU students' publication—The Stethoscope.





The History of Cebu Doctors' University

Cebu Doctors' College (CDC) was founded on May 17, 1975 and was registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) on June 29, 1976.

Cebu Doctors' College of Nursing (CDCN), then under the umbrella of Cebu Doctors' Hospital (CDH), was authorized to operate by the Department of Education, Culture, and Sports (DECS) in 1973. A sister institution, Cebu Doctors' College of Medicine (CDCM), a non-stock, nonprofit medical foundation, was next established on July 24, 1976. In line with the institution's objective to offer allied medical courses, six other colleges were subsequently opened: Cebu Doctors' College of Arts and Sciences (CDCAS) in 1975, Cebu **Doctors' College of Dentistry** (CDCD) in 1980, Cebu Doctors' College of Optometry (CDCO) in 1980, Cebu Doctors' College of Allied Medical Sciences (CDCAMS) in 1982, Cebu Doctors' College of Rehabilitative Sciences (CDCRS) in 1992, and Cebu Doctors' College of Pharmacy (CDCP) in 2004. Cebu

Doctors' College Graduate School opened in 1980.

On November 23, 2004, Cebu Doctors' College was granted University Status by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), thus the name Cebu Doctors' University was adopted.

On October 16, 2009, Cebu Doctors' University attained the CHED Institutional Quality Assurance through Monitoring and Evaluation (IQuAME) Category A(t).

On May 27, 2010, CHED granted the Autonomous Status to Cebu Doctors' University.

On December 2, 2015, the Department of Education granted Cebu Doctors' University the authority to operate Senior High School effective Academic Year 2016-2017.

Life is More Meaningful with Sacrifice

"Life is more meaningful with sacrifice."

Work hard, study hard, and make sacrifices." These are seven words of advice that Mr. Bayani have lived by right up to this point in his life. He is 63 years old, and has already dedicated 40 years of his life in service to Cebu Doctors' University. He has seen the institution grow from a college specializing in medical courses, to a university that is not only offering medical courses but also Arts and Sciences courses. I sat down with Sir Bayani to learn more about the University, his perspective and his life before and during his years of service and his plans in the years ahead.

Mr. Bayani grew up in Southern Cebu and graduated at Southwestern University (SWU) with a degree in Commerce. After that, he took up Masters in Business Administration. He was a working student all throughout his years at SWU. He had to juggle classes, a part time job in school that paid thirty pesos per hour, and a "house boy" job for a couple he had met in one of his jobs. Upon graduation he applied to many companies for employment. It was Cebu Doctors' College [now CDU] then located at Osmena Boulevard that hired him first. He was assigned at the office of the registrar in June 1, 1976. He first worked in the office of the College of Arts and Sciences since it was the CAS' dean who personally chose him for a job in

the CAS office. In 1985, he was assigned to teach Computer Science and became one of the pioneering instructors in tor until today.

When Cebu Doctors' College upgraded into a university that is now located in NRA Mandaue City, he became a Foreign Student Officer handling foreign student records and designing the office from 2005 until 2015. When asked about the most significant changed he has witnessed in CDU, he said it was the transformation from a college to a university because of the hard work of the administration and the support of the employees. "It was truly a real achievement," he said.

He also talked about being the founding president of CDC UNEMA (United Employees Association) back in June 21, 1986 which provided employees with services and assistance. He had said that back in the day, employees especially non-teaching personnel would hold activities like sport games for team-building and this was made possible through the support of the administration.

Working as an instructor at the same time working as officer really helped him in providing for his family together with his wife who was also working in the university. His two children, a daughter who is now a nurse working abroad, and a son who is now a computer engineer and a department chairman at the University of San Carlos are living proofs of his hard work for many years. Sir Bayani said he is very happy working in the university. "If I wasn't happy, I wouldn't have stayed," He said with a laugh. At 63 years old, Sir Bayani said he has no plans of retiring any time soon. He has decided, if he would be allowed, to work in the university even after his retirement. He wants to continue offering his services to the University and its students. He said that if the administration would let him, he would also like to continue teaching even when he is over the age of 65.

Before the interview ended I asked Sir Bayani one final question, "What piece of advice would you like to give to students? Especially those working part-time like you did?" His answer was simple but undeniably true. "Work hard, study hard, and make sacrifices. Life is more meaningful with sacrifice."

They go home. They go about their normal routine. Nothing has changed. Yet, somehow, everything is different.






